"Delita's exquisitely layered mural 'Blue is The Color We See Before We Die' is a visual eulogy dedicated to Yvette Smith and so many other women who have tragically lost their lives at the hands of law enforcement officials," said ARRAY Vice President of Public Programming, Mercedes Cooper.

Martin's piece unmasks Bastrop, Texas County Police Officer Daniel Willis' actions that resulted in the 2014 murder of Yvette Smith. Willis responded to a 911 domestic disturbance call by Ms. Smith, where she was acting as a peacemaker between two men. When Willis arrived at the scene, he shot Ms. Smith twice with his personal AR-15 as she opened the door.
